

## **Yealmpton Show**

### **Public Safety Notice**

The organisers of the Yealmpton Show have made considerable efforts to ensure that your visit to the Show is as enjoyable & safe as possible. To assist us, though, we do ask you to do the following:-

1. Be alert to your surroundings.
2. Take care of your children by keeping them close to you & under your direct supervision.
3. Keep push chairs away from large animals as they may react to them.
4. If you lose your child, go to the Secretary's tent. If you find a child, stay where you are & send a message to the Secretary's tent.
5. Park your car as directed by the stewards & take care when making your way to & from the Showground through the car park. When reversing your car, do so carefully.
6. Make yourself aware of the location of the First Aid tent, next to the Secretary's tent. A doctor is also present.
7. Keep your dogs on a lead at all times & away from the livestock.
8. The Show takes place in fields so the ground may be uneven or slippery in wet conditions.
9. Be aware that there are guy ropes & pegs around marquees & tents so avoid coming into contact with them.
10. Drink plenty of water if the weather is hot & use sunscreen or sunblock. Take regular rests.
11. Listen to public announcements & advice from the Stewards. Follow any instructions that are given.
12. Please put your litter in the bins.
13. Stay well away from moving machinery & vehicles & do not tamper with them. Stay behind barriers or ropes when watching demonstrations & horse events.
14. Do not walk in the Animal Collecting Rings or the Show Rings.
15. Remember that all animals & birds can be unpredictable so treat them with care.
16. Wash your hands thoroughly before eating if you have been handling animals.
17. When entering the Trade Marquees, take note of safety notices & exit signs.
18. Follow the safety advice when using the fairground rides.
19. Do not smoke in any of the marquees or tents.
20. Drink alcohol sensibly. Abusive or violent behaviour will not be tolerated & offenders may be removed from the Showground.
21. In an event of an emergency, please contact the nearest Steward who will deal with the problem.
22. If you hear a fire alarm/bell sounding, evacuate the area/marquee/tent & await instructions from a Steward or via the Public Address system.

### **Notice to Exhibitors & Competitors**

Exhibitors, traders & competitors must comply with the relevant Health & Safety regulations as well as the conditions of entry to the Show for traders & exhibitors.

The organisers of the Show accept no liability for injury to the person or any animal or for any loss or damage whatsoever suffered by any competitor or exhibitor in any horse-jumping or livestock competition or event. All such competitors & exhibitors take part at their own risk & before entering should inspect the course to satisfy themselves that the condition of the ground & construction of the fences are safe for competition.
