Class

1. Farmhouse Fruit Cake

125g soft margarine. 125g soft brown sugar. 1 rounded tbsp jam, any variety.

3 large eggs. 250g SR flour. 1-2 tbsps. milk

2 tsps mixed spice 300g mixed fruit

Method:

Grease & baseline an approx. 7"/ 18cms round cake tin. Cream together margarine & sugar, and add eggs with a little flour. Fold in the rest of the flour, fruit &jam. Add milk if necessary to give a dropping consistency. Turn into prepared tin. Bake in moderate oven 160c /Gas 3. for approx. 1hr 10mins.

2. Cherry and Coconuct cake

250g SR flour. 125g butter 75g Desiccated Coconut.

125g caster sugar. 2 eggs. 125g glace cherries, finely chopped

8fl ozs milk

Method:

Grease & base line a 7" Round cake tin.

Rub butter into flour until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar, coconut & cherries.

Whisk together eggs & milk & mix into the dry ingredients. Turn into the prepared tin & bake in oven 170C/Gas 3-4
